TUITION ASSISTANCE

2022-2023

Pullman Christian School seeks to help families desiring to provide Christian schooling for their children but who may find it financially challenging to do so. Tuition assistance is awarded based upon a family's ability to pay and their commitment to Christian education for their children. We utilize an online Grant & Aid application, evaluated by an outside third party, and then the recommendation is brought to the school's Tuition Assistance Committee. In order for the school to be as helpful as possible to the largest number of families, tuition assistance grants will generally not exceed 50% of total tuition. However, the Tuition Assistance Committee may exceed this standard in exceptional cases. Families may submit a Grant & Aid Application through the FACTS Family Portal. Family Portal accounts are created at the time of enrollment to Pullman Christian School.

A \$35.00 application fee is due at the time of submitting the Grant & Aid Application. Grand & Aid Applications are due by **May 20th for returning families**. Families will be notified of the amount of tuition assistance being awarded to them prior to the July 1st withdrawal date. The Grant & Aid Application is available to **new families enrolling through June 15th**. Grant & Aid Applications submitted after the deadline will still be considered but may not be able to receive as much of an award.

Grant & Aid Applications need to be resubmitted each year, even if the family received tuition assistance for the previous school year.

Please note that the decision to continue tuition assistance will take into consideration the following:

- Was the family/student involved and supportive throughout the year as evidenced by the following?
 - Did they attend required parent meetings and conferences?
 - Do they contribute to fundraising efforts?
 - Have they been supportive of school programs and policies?
 - Were disagreements, concerns, etc. handled in a biblical way according to the Parent-Student Handbook guidelines?
 - Has the student been compliant with school rules and policies? Were there any serious disciplinary issues?
- Has the student shown academic success?
 - If the student has received more than one "F" within any one grading period during the previous year, or if the cumulative GPA falls below 2.0, the student will be put on probationary status for one additional year. If the student has two consecutive years of failing grades or continued low GPA, the student will be ineligible to receive tuition assistance the following year. Students with special circumstances, who have displayed effort, could appeal this to the Tuition Assistance Committee. The appeal would need to include letters from the teachers that reflect the student's effort and participation in class.
- Has the student had good attendance and been on time to classes?
 - If the student has suffered loss of credit due to poor attendance, or had tardiness issues to the point of needing to serve suspensions, the student will either be disqualified for tuition assistance for the following year (if the problem was severe) or will be on probationary status for one additional year. If the student has two consecutive years of poor attendance, the student will be ineligible to receive tuition assistance.
